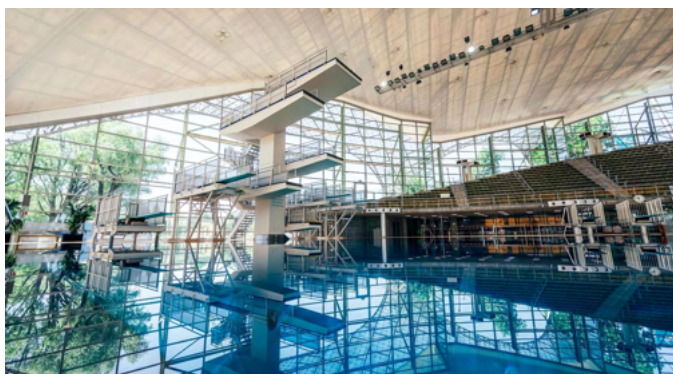
VENUE OVERVIEW



The competition will be held at the Olympic Swimming Pool inside the **Olympic Park Munich**.

The 1500 seat facility features a competition pool (21m x 50m) and two warm-up pools (12,5m x 50m/21m x 21m).

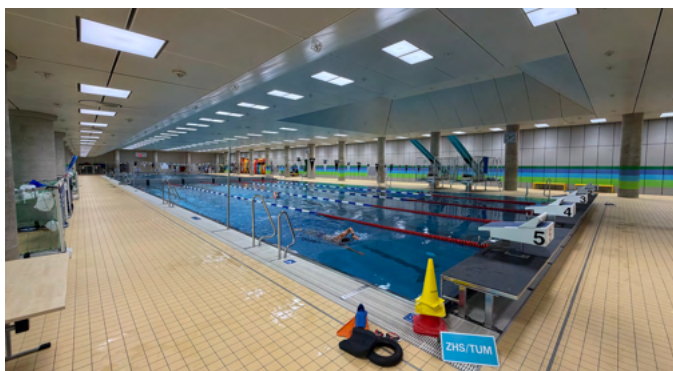
Both pools have a depth of 2.5m.

FINAL SPORTS ENTRIES

European Aquatics will send to the respective Federations the link to enter European Aquatics EMS System for Final Sport Entries and Accreditations. Feel free to contact **swimming@europeanaquatics.org** for any additional questions.

PARTICIPANTS

All European Aquatics Federations are eligible to participate in the European Aquatics Junior Swimming Championships.

COMMUNICATIONS

The official communication channel in the days prior to and during the event will be the Sportity app. More information will be provided in Information Bulletin 2.





ACCREDITATION

On the first day of training, the members of each team will receive their accreditation cards from the accreditation center after their identification.

NATIONAL FEDERATIONS' INSURANCE & RESPONSABILITY

The Insurance of the participants is the responsibility of the respective federations. All athletes are under the responsibility of their respective Team Leaders throughout the entire duration of the event. Team Leaders are responsible for the supervision of their athletes at all times, including outside the competition venue and when using public transportation or moving between official locations.

MEDICAL SERVICES AND DOPING CONTROL

Medical service will be available during the stay of the teams in Munich according to European Aquatics Medical Guidelines ; it will be available at training and competition facilities. In case of a medical emergency, the patient will be transported to Munich Clinic Schwabing, which is on duty and located approximately 10 minutes from the competition venue.

Doping controls will be according to the European Aquatics Medical Guidelines and the WADA International Standards.

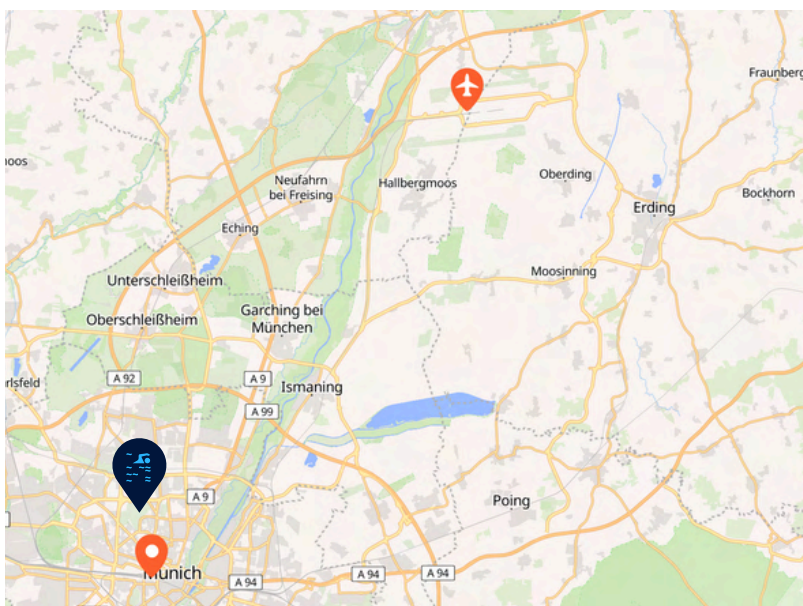


5. LOGISTICS (ACCOMMODATION & TRANSPORTATION)

TRANSPORTATION

The LOC will provide transportation to and from the airport or train stations listed below and between hotels and the venue. This service is part of the accommodation package booked via the LOC.

PICK UP SPOTS	
Arrival via airplane	<p>Munich International Airport (MUC) Nearest airport, located approx. 45 minutes (35km) from the venue. Transfers will be arranged upon arrival at this airport for delegations whose reservations at one of the official hotels have been made through and confirmed by the Local Organizing Committee.</p>
Arrival via train	<p>Munich Main Station Main railway hub, welcoming trains from all major German and European cities. The venue is easily accessible within approximately 25 minutes by taking the underground line U2 to Scheidplatz and continuing on the line U3 to Olympiazentrum. Or via a shuttle transfer by car/bus in 25 to 35 minutes (5km). Transfers will be arranged upon arrival at this train station for delegations whose reservations at one of the official hotels have been made through and confirmed by the Local Organizing Committee.</p>



Please note that if you arrive at any airport or station not listed above, the LOC will not be able to offer transportation to the hotel/venue. You will need to make your own way to one of the listed airports or stations to access LOC-provided transportation. Otherwise, you will need to arrange your own travel to the hotel/venue.



VISA

Each team is responsible to ensure they have the proper documentation to enter Germany. Please scan the following qr-code to check if you require an entry VISA:

MEDICAL SERVICES AND ANTI DOPING

Medical services will be available throughout the teams' stay in Munich at the competition venue. In case of a medical emergency, the patient will be transported to Munich Clinic Schwabing, which is on duty and located approximately 10 minutes from the competition venue. Doping control will be conducted in accordance with the European Aquatics Medical Guidelines and the WADA International Standards.



ACCOMMODATION

To provide participating nations with a smooth and professional event experience, the LOC's accommodation package includes a range of services beyond standard lodging. The below mentioned benefits apply for teams staying at one of the official event hotels.

Please be informed that European Aquatics has started a new partnership with WIZ-Team, an event management software provider, to support the organisation of European Aquatics Championships from this year onward.

Accommodation booking procedures and deadlines will remain unchanged.

To support the introduction of the system, National Federations are kindly asked to complete the accommodation forms as usual but and to enter other needed information into the new online platform, which will open in April. More details will follow shortly.

We appreciate your cooperation and patience during this transition, which is expected to simplify and improve processes for all stakeholders in the future.

Please note: Cancellations are free of charge before 10 April 2026. After this date, cancellations will be charged 100%.

Should the preferred hotel be fully booked, reservations will be upgraded to the next available higher category, subject to availability. The corresponding rate of the higher category will apply. Allocation is handled on a first-come, first-served basis.

Please note that we have asked the hotels to close the minibars and to lock pay-TV channels. If you want to use these services, please talk to the receptionists. The telephone lines are open. If you use any of these devices/services, you will have to pay for them directly at the hotel. The LOC does not bear any additional costs.

Please note that the earliest arrival date has been set due to several major international stadium and arena events (hosting up to 70,000 spectators per night) taking place in Munich during the Championship period. These events significantly affect hotel availability across the city.

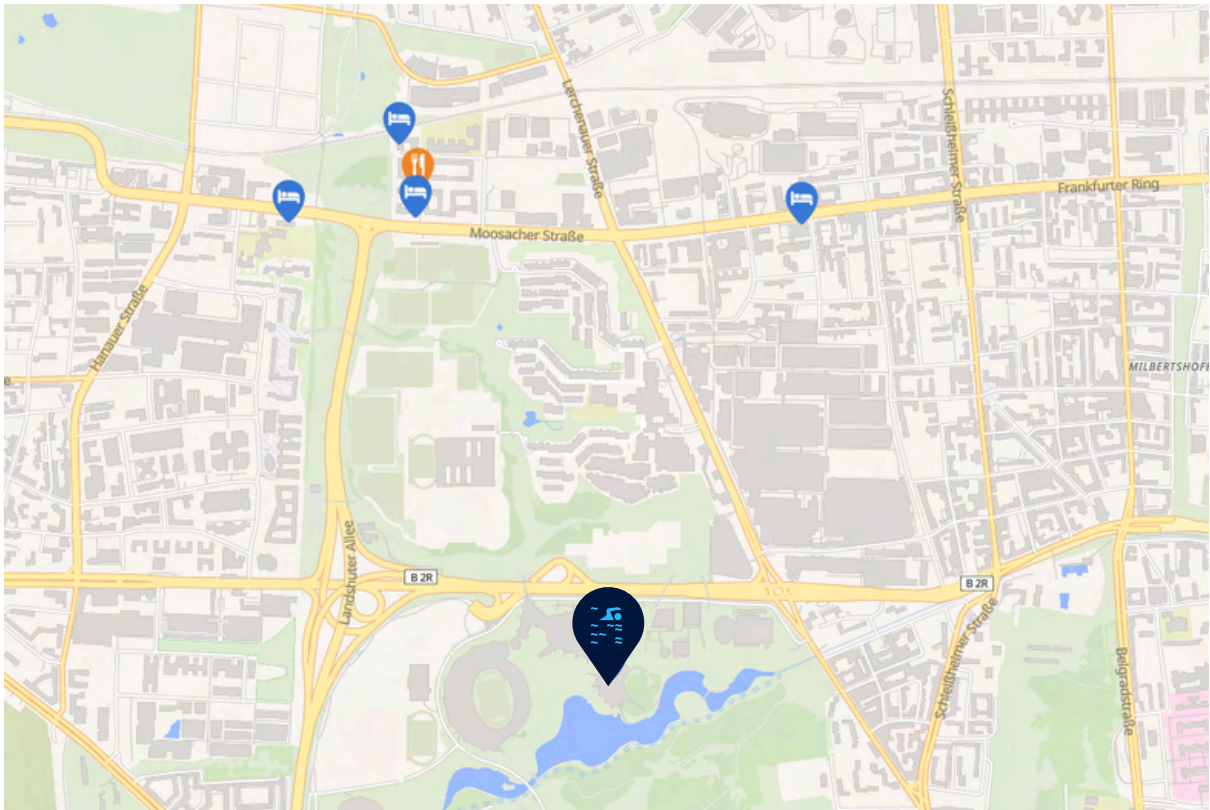
Federations planning to arrive on 4 July are kindly requested to submit an early arrival request to the LOC in advance. As hotel capacity in the official hotels is restricted during this period, all early arrivals must be coordinated by the LOC. Once the available allocation is exhausted, the LOC will assist federations in identifying suitable alternative accommodation options.

Federations that book early arrival accommodation in the Official Hotels through the LOC will be provided with airport transfers to their respective hotels.

The LOC is offering four different hotel options for participating teams. The majority of hotels are located within 30 minute of walking or shuttle transfer distance to the competition venue.

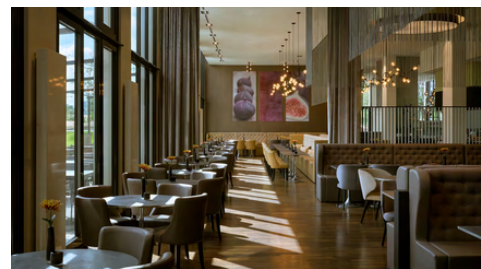

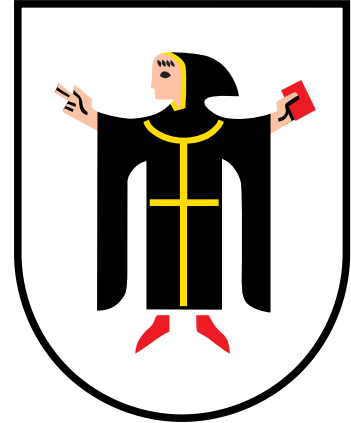


6. HOST CITY & COUNTRY INFORMATION

Marienplatz

The heartbeat of Munich: St. Mary's Square, the world-famous center of the state capital, is home to the New Town Hall. No matter the time of year, there's always something happening near the Column of St. Mary.



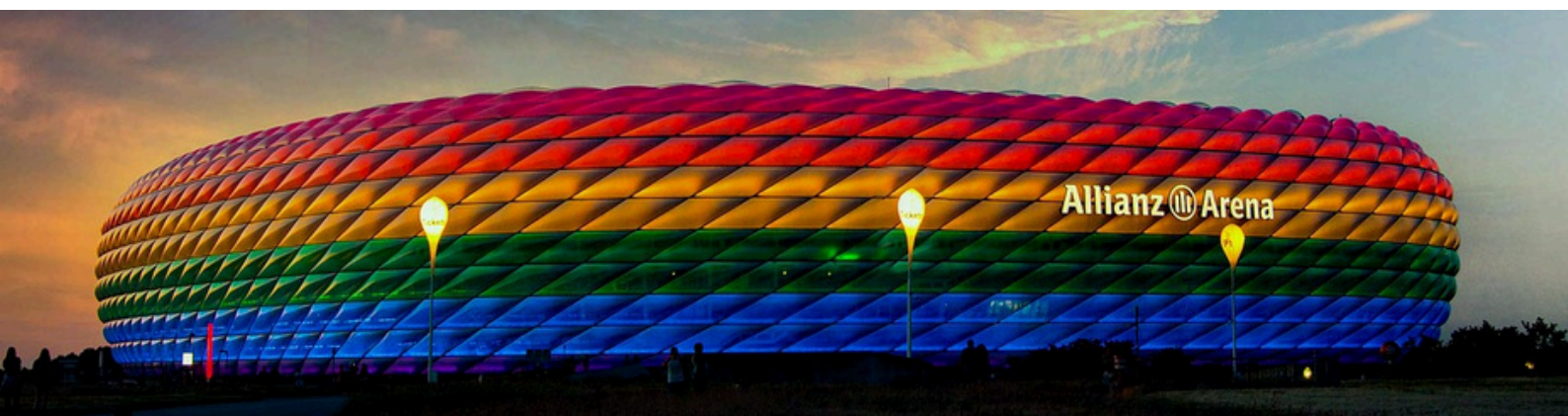
Frauenkirche

Built in the 15th century, the gothic "Cathedral of Our Lady" or Frauenkirche in German, was and is an unmistakable symbol of the city. The 500-year-old brick building is the seat of the Archbishop of Munich.



Nymphenburg Palace

Travel back in time to the age of the Bavarian monarchy: the extensive park with its pavilions, fountains, flower gardens and impressive palace buildings is a source of fascination.



Allianz Arena

The Allianz Arena is one of the most spectacular stadiums in the world and a real Munich highlight. Inside, you can expect an impressive atmosphere, state-of-the-art technology, and space for over 70,000 sports-loving people.



MUNICH SIGHTS



English Garden

Munich's green lung: covering an area of 375 hectares, the English Garden is one of the largest inner-city parks in the world. It is not only a popular recreational area in Munich and ideal for sports such as jogging, cycling, or volleyball.



Eisbachwelle

Surfing action in the middle of the city? You can see it all year round on the Eisbach wave. Even if you're not participating, you can relax and watch the spectacle from the shore or from the small bridge directly above the wave.



Olympic Park

The Olympic Park is an architectural landmark of Munich and the venue of the 1972 Olympic Games. The iconic tent roof, the Olympic Tower with its panoramic view, and the extensive green spaces make it a unique mix of sports, culture, and recreation. The EJC event venue (swimming pool) is located in the Olympic Park.



LOCAL SPECIALTIES

Brezel

The Bavarian Brezel is a freshly baked pretzel with a crisp, dark crust and a soft interior, traditionally sprinkled with coarse salt. It's a classic companion to typical beverages and enjoyed throughout the day.



Weißwurst with sweet mustard

Weißwurst is a mild, pale sausage made from veal and pork back bacon, traditionally served before noon with sweet mustard. In Bavaria, it's often eaten without cutlery, alongside a Brezel.



Kaiserschmarrn

Kaiserschmarrn is a fluffy, shredded pancake, lightly caramelized and dusted with powdered sugar. Originally an Alpine specialty, it's typically served warm with apple compote or plum roast.
